The exhibit launched at the AQS Daytona Show, February 22-25, and will be featured at the AQS Branson Show, March 22-25, and the AQS Paducah Show, April 26-29. The exhibit is open to attendees at the show and is included in the admission price.

The *All-Star Quilts of Valor* book and exhibit feature Quilts of Valor from quilt industry designers, several who have supported QOVF through the years. At Daytona, designer and author Sue Reich and designer Robin Koehler were at the show signing books. Sue serves as QOVF's Board Chair and Robin serves as a QOVF Board Member.

After the AQS Show in Paducah, the quilts from the exhibit will go to the National Quilt Museum for a special

NATIONAL CHAPLAIN AWARDED QUILT OF VALOR

Over the last several years, my husband and I have attended every winter conference and annual convention for the American Legion in North Dakota. This year, on the night prior to the start of the winter conference, there was a special recognition banquet for the gentleman who had been elected last fall at the National Convention of the American Legion in Indianapolis to be the National Chaplain for the coming year. We had met Mark years earlier when he served as the ND American Legion Chaplain. When I heard that Mark A. was going to be recognized, I knew I needed to check to see if he had ever been awarded a Quilt of Valor.

As we hear from so many veterans who are awarded Quilts of Valor, Mark did not feel he warranted being awarded a QOV. However, after talking to him, it became clear to me that his role over the years provided so much support to our troops over a period of 26 years. Mark served from 1977 to 2003 with the

Army in several different branches: the US Army Reserve, the US Army, and ND Army National Guard. During his military service, Mark was assigned to the 367th Combat Engineer Battalion; the 2nd Brigade out of Fort Jackson; NATO Headquarters in Brussels, Belgium; and a medical group with the ND US Army Reserve. Mark concluded his career as a member of the ND Army National Guard from 1994 to 2003, retiring in 2003 at the rank of Major.

Mark spent his entire career listening, providing support, and ministering to service members and their families. In his 20+ years of counseling, Mark heard many life stories from soldiers, sailors, airmen, marines, and coast guard members. He helped

prepare thousands of young soldiers for combat duty and said he held it a sacred trust to have heard the life stories of countless veterans, as well as the spouses and family members. Mark said the real heroes are those who endured the hardship on the battlefield.

It was an honor for our Stitching Hearts QOV group to award a QOV to this newly appointed National Chaplain. It was also a special night for me as I was able to personally meet one of my group leaders from the opposite corner of the State and have her assist me in wrapping Mark with his QOV since the conference was being held in the town where she lives. Prior to that night, we had only been phone and email acquaintances.

I was initially contacted by a QOVF representative from Kentucky since I lived close to the veteran, at least that is what she hoped. Little did she know that this young Marine was being presented a new home in nearby Indiana by Homes For Our Troops (www.hfotusa.org), and that it was about a mile down the road from where I live. Once I learned this veteran had served in the Marine Corps, I knew that I wanted to make an extra special quilt. So, I checked my fabric stash, knowing I had a panel with a Marine Corps theme. From there, I made blocks and added the Corps logo at the top. He loved it and several family members talked to me after the event, telling me how much he appreciated it. It did my heart good to know I had made a special quilt for this young man, but also that I was able to attend such an event. This was the first home presented to a veteran by HFOT in Indiana, and it is beautiful! QOVF has partnered with HFOT so that all those veterans receiving homes also receive quilts at what is called the Key Ceremony (when the veteran officially receives the key to his or her home). What a wonderful partnership!

NEW JERSEY WRAPS 74 VETERANS

On Tuesday January 24, 2023, myself, along with eight members of the Turtle Creek Peacemakers Group from Hamilton, NJ, awarded 74 Quilts of Valor to residents of the New Jersey Veterans Memorial Home at Menlo Park in Edison, NJ. Of the 74 quilts presented, awardees consisted of 47 Korean War veterans, 15 WWII veterans and 12 Vietnam veterans.

The Turtle Creek Peacemakers are based in Central NJ and have about 22 members. Prior to this presentation, they had previously presented about 150 Quilts of Valor. Introductions and an overview of Quilts of Valor and Turtle Creek Peacemakers was made by the NJ State Coordinator. The names of the veterans were read by the Director of Recreation as each veteran was presented with their certificate and wrapped in their Quilt of Valor. The staff at the Veterans Memorial Home assisted in presenting and wrapping the veterans in their quilts. The staff was as excited for this event as the veterans. Some of the quilts will be presented to the veterans in their rooms by staff members due to various medical conditions.

Also present for the presentation were Vincent Solomeno, NJ Acting Deputy Commissioner of Military & Veteran Affairs; Robert Karabinchak, NJ State Assemblyman; Sharon McGreevey, Veterans Advocate for NJ State Senator Joe Vitale; Sam Joshi, Mayor Township



of Edison; Robin Goodrich, NJ Veterans Memorial Home at Menlo Park Advisory Council Member, along with other members of the Department of Military and Veteran Affairs staff. "These quilts reflect not only the sacrifices of our military community, but the incredible heart of these volunteers who donated their time, quilting skills, and financial resources. The hours and care placed in every stitch reflect tremendous

dedication to our veterans and country," stated US Army Brigadier General Hou.

Five of the veterans who received QOVs will be turning 100 in 2023 and one will be turning 102 in November. US Navy veteran William C., a submarine rescue chief petty officer who served from 1952-1956, compared the experience of receiving one of the quilts to that of receiving a medal. "I've never seen anything like it, I feel proud, I want to cry ... really it's so nice to be recognized."

The Veterans Memorial Home has 188 veterans, so we anticipate returning in the future to present the remaining 114 veterans with quilts. A special thank you goes to Terry Dearden, DMAVA, and Christine Caratozzolo, Director of Recreation, for all their assistance in working with us in order to coordinate this event, which was a huge success.
