

# Clue #1

- 1. Gather 58 light background squares and 58 contrast squares.
- 2. Sew the light-background and contrast squares in pairs as shown. Press the seams toward the contrast squares.



#### Clue #2

- 1. Gather 40 of the pairs completed in clue 1.
- 2. Sew the pairs into Four-Patch units as shown. Make sure the contrast squares are diagonally opposite each other. Press the seam allowances in one direction. Make 20.

# Clue #3

- 1. Gather 49 contrast rectangles and 49 light rectangles.
- 2. Sew pairs of rectangles together along their long edges. Press the seam allowances toward the dark rectangles.


#### Clue #4

#### ROW A.

- 1. Gather six contrast rectangles, 12 units completed in clue 3 and 15 feature squares.
- 2. Assemble three rows as shown. Begin and end each row with a contrast rectangle. Pay close attention to positions of the contrast rectangles in the units from clue 3. Press the seams in one direction.

#### Row B

- 1. Gather six background rectangles, 12 units completed in clue 3 and 15 feature squares.
- 2. Assemble three rows as shown. Begin and end each row with a background rectangle. Pay close attention to positions of the background rectangles in the units from clue 3. Press the seams in one direction.



# Clue #5 ROW C:

- 1. Gather 12 Four-Patch units completed in Clue 2, 15 units completed in Clue 3, and 6 units completed in Clue 1.
- 2. Assemble three sets as shown. Pay close attention to the positions of the contrast pieces. Press the seams in one direction.



Clue 5, Row C, Assemble 3 rows

#### Clue #6

- 1. Gather eight Four-Patch units completed in clue 2, 10 units completed in clue 3, and 4 units completed in clue 1.
- 2. Assemble two rows as shown. Pay close attention to the positions of the contrast pieces. Press the seams in one direction. This is ROW D.



Clue 7, Row D, Assemble 2 rows

#### Clue #7

- 1. Gather the remaining contrast and background squares and rectangles, and the remaining units completed in clue 1.
- 2. Assemble one of each row shown, paying close attention to the positions of the contrast pieces. Press the seams in one direction. These are ROWS E and F.



# Clue #8

- 1. Lay out the rows in the following order:
  - a. Row E
  - b. Row A
  - c. Row C
  - d. Row B
  - e. Row D
  - f. Row A

# NOW -

- g. Row C
- h. Row B
- i. Row D
- j. Row A
- k. Row C
- I. Row B
- m. Row F

Notice that every feature square is completely surrounded by either all background bars or all contrast bars. Sew the rows together and press well.

2. Add borders and finish your quilt.

#### **Adding Borders**

#### Borders #1 and 2:

- 1. Measure the length of your quilt, taking the measurement down the center.
- 2. Measure the width of your quilt, taking the measurement across the center.
- 3. Write these measurements down.
- 4. Using the length measurement and feature fabric and light background fabric, cut two side borders each, 2 ½" X length of quilt. Sew one of each strip together on long side to make first border side pieces.
- 5. Sew these to the side of your quilt, feature fabric closest to the quilt top.
- 6. Using the width measurement from step 1, make two border pieces 2 ½" X width measurement.
- 7. Make 4 four patches using 2 ½" squares, as shown in diagram.
- 8. Add one four patch to each end of width borders as shown in diagram being sure to keep fabrics opposite side borders to create effect. Sew top and bottom borders to quilt.

#### Border #3:

- 1. Measure the length of quilt through the center of the quilt, edge to edge. Prepare two side borders from feature fabric, 3 ½" X length measurement; sew these borders to the sides of your quilt.
- 2. Measure the width of your quilt across the center of the quilt, edge to edge. Prepare top and bottom borders 3 ½" X length of measurement; sew these borders to the top and bottom of your quilt.
